## Art Exhibition by HCA Hospice Care (HCA) and Sound of Art, Fulfils Late Patient's Final Wish

HCA Hospice Care (HCA) has launched the *Taking Flight* Exhibition at i12 Katong to fulfil a late patient's final wish to showcase her works and share her passion for art. Jointly organised by HCA and local art gallery Sound of Art and supported by i12

Katong, *Taking Flight* showcases a selection of Mdm Annie Hoor Ngan Thye's favourite watercolour works.

The late Annie, 60, only formally took up watercolour classes in 2018 when she moved to Singapore from Malaysia to help her daughter care for her children. In the short span of a few years, the doting grandmother had completed numerous paintings, capturing precious memories of travel adventures and the interesting birds she would encounter on her walks.

"Despite the hardship she faced in raising her children, Annie never complained," says HCA Art Therapist Kimo Ong. "She was cheery and optimistic, and through her artworks, she hoped for people to see the best in life in spite of the adversities they may be facing."



On the HCA team's home visits to Annie prior to her passing at the end of last month, the affable lady readily shared about the narrative behind each painting.



When the HCA team broached the idea of an exhibition to showcase her works, as part of the "A Good Day" project, Annie was delighted.

HCA's "A Good Day" project explores what a good day means to HCA's patients, which often includes simple but heartfelt wishes.
