BEYOND THE CALL OF DUTY: NURSE CYCLES TO FUNDRAISE FOR CHILDREN WITH LIFE-LIMITING ILLNESS

"Tears and heartbreaks are big part of our job. It might be sad but there are bright lights everywhere – the children's resilience and their parents' love. I often tell myself to be courageous and to be prepared for uncertainty." Nurse Poh Ya Nee

HCA Star PALS Palliative Care Nurse Poh Ya Nee has persisted over the years, as she faced the deaths of her young patients with life-limiting illness.

Star PALS (Paediatric Advanced Life Support) is a service provided by HCA Hospice Care (HCA), to improve the quality of life for children and minors up to 19 years of age, with life-threatening or life-limiting conditions. This may range from neurological or congenital conditions to childhood cancers. This service is provided free of charge.

Nurse Ya Nee added, this time with a renewed sense of determination,

"It is indeed a job that requires us to love openly and bid farewell readily. Every single minute matters. I'm cycling to tell their stories, of their courage, of their hopes and dreams. **It's not about dying, it's about living.**"

Nurse Ya Nee truly exemplifies the spirit of going beyond the call of duty.

A marketing professional-turned-nurse, she was one of the first riders and staff to sign up for The Dandelion Ride, dedicating time and effort outside of work to raise awareness of the cause among her friends and family.

Collectively, the Star PALS team has raised almost \$10,000 in two months from 96 donors. Nurse Ya Nee alone has raised more than S\$3800. Inspired by Ya Nee's passion and dedication to her young patients, the mother of a pair of siblings under the care of Star PALS team – Jeng Yu and Isaac donated S\$500 in her children's name.

The Dandelion Ride is a cycling-fundraising event organized by HCA. The event aims to raise \$300,000 for 1,000 home visits to provide care and comfort for patients with life limiting illnesses, so that patients can spend their last days with dignity at home, in the presence of their loved ones. The event has raised about S\$190,000 to date, allowing us to make just over 600 home visits.
